Norms for Lenten Observance

The liturgical season of Lent begins February 14. The following are guidelines of Lenten observance for the faithful in the Archdiocese of Ottawa.

• Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays are days of abstinence.

Fasting binds all persons from 18 to 59 years, unless prevented by poor health. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids may be taken.

Abstinence from meat binds all persons who are 14 and older, unless prevented by poor health. In the Archdiocese of Ottawa, the consumption of meat is not allowed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent. The Archbishop mandates this observance for the spiritual well-being of the faithful.

Lent is a penitential season and, as such, religious practices such as daily Mass, the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Stations of the Cross, works of charity and justice, and acts of self-denial are highly encouraged.

Tools and Support for Sharing the Good News: 3 Session Course this Lent

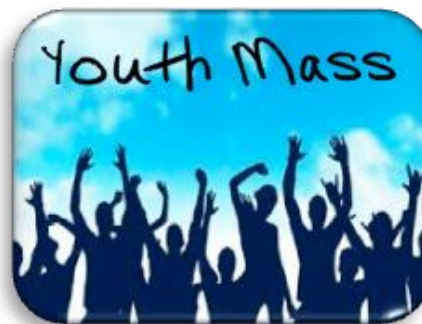
Join us in the Parish Hall for three evenings this Lent as we present tools, answers and discussions that will help us in talking about our faith to others. Our focus will include:

The first campaign of 2018 is the Call for Conscience, inviting our elected Members of Provincial Parliament (MPPs) and those seeking office this June to increase funding/access to palliative care, to protect health care workers wishing to abstain from any involvement in euthanasia/assisted suicide and to protect faith based facilities from participation in euthanasia/assisted suicide.
