

"Simon Peter said to them, 'I am going fishing.'" Peter is a favorite apostle for many people. I wonder if it is because of his flawed, relatable humanity. Today's Gospel takes place after Jesus appears to the disciples and breathes the Holy Spirit upon them. And yet, Peter finds himself returning to his old way of life, to comfortable habits he formed long before following Jesus. Is something still lingering in him? Is something still lingering in us? Lent is over, and we should be rejoicing! But do you feel like you're still holding onto something? Or perhaps you had an excellent Lent. You encountered Jesus in a new way and grew in faith. But as the weeks since Easter have slipped by, some of your newfound devotion has begun to waver. The closeness you felt in your Lenten commitments has given way to humdrum status quo or turn-of-the-season busyness.

"Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter has endured so much in his walk of discipleship! But something is still weighing on him. In today's Gospel, Jesus confirms Peter's devotion three times, a redemption of his earlier threefold denial. The call of the Lord must come again, as if heard anew for the first time. So often, this is the pattern of the Christian life. We discover God and experience a new desire for our faith, but in time, our enthusiasm begins to wane. Perhaps something happens that startles us, or we startle ourselves by a poor decision. Then we discover God anew! Our joy returns...for a while. Even the Apostles were no strangers to the cyclical nature of spiritual growth. Our disappointments or frustrations should not be cause for giving up. Like Peter, we too can recommit and start anew. This Sunday and every day of our lives, Jesus is waiting to say again, "Follow me."

Twelve Hours of Prayer For Palliative Care – May 8

The Catholic Women's League of Canada calls all people of faith to join nationwide in 12 Hours of Prayer for Palliative Care during National Hospice Palliative Care Week (May 5-11), as a profound witness to the sanctity of human life. All parishioners, family and friends are invited to join St. Leonard's CWL in prayer and solidarity on Wednesday, May 8, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. in our Church. Come spend an hour or so in front of the Blessed Sacrament in silent prayer. If you are unable to attend, may we encourage you to offer up your prayer time in support of palliative care in our nation. There is a pressing need for all Canadians to have greater accessibility to palliative care. This end-of-life care is true compassion. It allows individuals who are facing death to not be burdened by pain and suffering but to receive the support that respects their human dignity both physically and spiritually. Pope Francis reminds us, "Let us not underestimate the power of so many voices united in prayer."


Your generosity has helped D&P offer support in emergencies, such as the current problems suffered by the people in Mozambique, recently hit by two devastating cyclones this past month - \$50,000 was sent so far.

Our group also supported the Pope's effort to walk the circumference of the globe in solidarity with refugees and migrants by joining Archbishop Prendergast, S. J. and Archbishop Durocher in the Share the Journey walk on April 6th - a beautiful sunny day. Approximately 115 people participated in the walk, giving us 575 miles to contribute. We were joined by partners of D&P - notably Gustavo "el profe" Moncayo of Columbia who managed to peacefully have his kidnapped son released by the FARC in 2010 - and continues to negotiate for peace in his country.
